Legislative Activity

PRISM Lobbyist, Jason Schmelzer, provided an update on the beginning of the legislative session. This is the second half of a two year session. Bill introductions have been slow this year; however the deadline to introduce bills is next Friday so we can expect to see additional bills introduced. COVID-19 numbers are coming down and the Governor and local governments are responding accordingly with updates and changes to existing guidelines. The Governor signed the COVID Supplemental Paid Sick Leave bill on February 9th, which provided payroll tax credits for some small businesses, but no funding for local governments and non-profits. This is an election year and we will see a lot of activity relating to that.

2021 Fall Retreat Recap

A strategic planning retreat was conducted virtually in November 2021 as part of the annual process of strategic planning for PRISM. Members of the Executive Committee and Committee Chairs and/or Vice Chairs participated in this four two-hour planning sessions, with the focus on the following topics:

- Should PRISM develop an EAP/Wellness program for public safety personnel?
- Should PRISM expand in-house services in the areas of legal (employment legal consulting, contract review, and coverage evaluations), claims auditing and workers' compensation claims administration?
- Should PRISM expand legislative efforts with an emphasis on tort reform?
- Should PRISM revisit county/non-county participation and representation in PRISM governance?

Staff provided a summary of the outcome of the Fall Retreat.

Legislative Action Plan

One of the outcomes of the Fall Retreat included expanding our influence in the legislative arena. The Executive Committee deemed certain priority items with the goal of trying to complete these within 6-12 months.

- Discuss results of the CAJPA tort study with members and support them in influencing their local officials to change the mindset and effect change over time.
- Continue to work with partners to define a common position and strengthen a coalition around this issue.
- Continue to build relationships with legislators and look for opportunities to influence minds on this issue.

The Executive Committee has directed the Legislative Committee to discuss and consider the following:

- Determine a "vehicle" to drive legislative or cultural change regarding verdicts and awards.
- This may require dollars to be set aside to build resources for when the political climate changes.
- Distribute the Legislative Action Plan to members so they can consider including aspects in the legislative platform.

The Committee approved the development of a Legislative Action Plan. Staff will begin working on this and present to the Committee at a future meeting.
