Quick Start Steps

1. Call [LeeAnn](#) with Community Matters to discuss the Safe School Ambassadors Program.
2. You will need to provide the number of school sites and a coordinator for each location.
3. Select 2 consecutive days for training. Once the dates are confirmed, a contract will need to be completed between the agency and Community Matters.
4. Provide an internal staff presentation on safe school ambassadors – to let them know about the program and gain buy-in.
5. Identify 4-8 staff members at each location who will participate in the program. This will include attending student ambassador training and meeting with the student ambassadors to provide ongoing support throughout the school year.
6. Select up to 40 student ambassadors and request completed permission slips.
7. Community Matters will provide training for the selected student ambassadors and staff members.
